The St Andrews Global Challenges Forum will host a four-part symposia webinar series in October 2021 on the overarching theme of 'Sustainable Futures'. These topics are applicable to the SFC-funded GCRF projects portfolio as underlying issues are being addressed with more discipline-specific research. We intend that they will form the basis for substantive interdisciplinary discussions.


Professor Thomas Meagher is the Director of the St Andrews Global Challenges Forum, working in close collaboration with the Global Challenges Research Fund (GCRF) team in Research and Innovation Services (RIS) at the University of St Andrews.

A strong advocate for the University's Global Challenges agenda, he has held an active role in the Forum's Steering Committee. His expertise in the field of plant biology, combined with his enthusiasm for engaging at a 'Global' scale, are reflected in his research interest in the urgency of development challenges in Amazonia. He is committed to the need for interdisciplinary approaches to find solutions to the many problems affecting communities across our planet.

Professor Thomas Meagher will also present as a speaker on *"Remote sensing for the sustainable use of seasonally dry tropical forests"* accompanied by Dr Marcelo Freire Moro from the *Universidade Federal do Ceara*.

Dr Rebekah Widdowfield has been the Chief Executive of the Royal Society of Edinburgh since 2017 and has spent much of her career working at the interface of policy and academia. Having worked in academia for a number of years, Rebekah joined the Scottish Government to pursue a more applied research career.

She became a senior civil servant in 2008 serving as Head of Rural and Environmental Science and Analysis and Chief Researcher before becoming Head of Higher Education and Science. Rebekah supported a number of strategic advances during her time in Government including helping establish the Centre of Expertise on Climate Change, ClimateXChange.


As a plant biologist, she was a researcher and technology transfer specialist in the International Potato Centre, Head of the National Institute of Natural Resources and actually, President of the Peruvian Foundation for Nature Conservation - Pronaturaleza, member of the Consultive Board of WWF-Peru, among others.

Professor Gibson Kibiki, MD, MMed, PhD is the former and Founding CEO of the East African Health Research Commission (EAHRC). EAHRC, through research, provides advice and guidance on health to the six countries of the of the East African Community.

Gibson is a Professor of medicine, consultant physician/endoscopist, researcher, and a leader with broad experience in health and academics. He led the establishment of Kilimanjaro Clinical Research Institute, which is an academic centre for evidence-based health interventions. He has led numerous international collaborative research programmes. He has held academic positions in Africa, America, and Europe.

#### "Evidence-based policy for conservation and pro-environmental livelihoods: lessons learned from natural and social science diagnostics for a Kenyan marine protected area"




**Speaker** Dr Marcelo Freire Moro *Universidade Federal do Ceara*


